- This program is not necessary for schools to teach. My son has been informed of this along with many other topics that the schools need not be involved in. Please use school time more effectively to teach what schools should be teaching (math, science, reading etc)
- I feel I can do a better job teaching my children at home about this issue.
- I'm not underestimating the importance of preventing sexual abuse, we just feel as a family that the responsibility lies on the parents of the child rather than on the school to teach the material. This is subject we prefer, for us, to teach our child at home.
- I just do not agree about children all of the things and discussing it at such an early age. I understand that they could be in danger and are at any given point but they are too young to be introduced to the topic being discussed.
