

The CAC is committed to providing support services to all child victims of sexual abuse. We recognize that not every *Forensic Interview* will be done at the CAC; however, these victims are still eligible for services.

Advocacy: If you have a case that is going to court, the CAC will provide support for the family. If families have questions about the court process, they can also be directed to Jessica.

Therapy: The Family Advocate will follow up with all caregivers of victims to offer services or refer to services in the community. Fax or scan police reports to Jessica directly.

Non-Emergent medicals: The CAC partners with the YWCA SANE program to conduct nonemergent medicals for victims of sexual abuse regardless of a disclosure. If you feel a child would benefit from this service, Law Enforcement or the family can call CAC Intake Coordinator, Hannah, directly.

Problematic Sexualized Behavior: Reports of children 9 and under, who are acting out sexually, can be referred to the CAC for a screening and body safety counseling. You can let the family know that someone from the CAC will be following up with information and send the report over.
